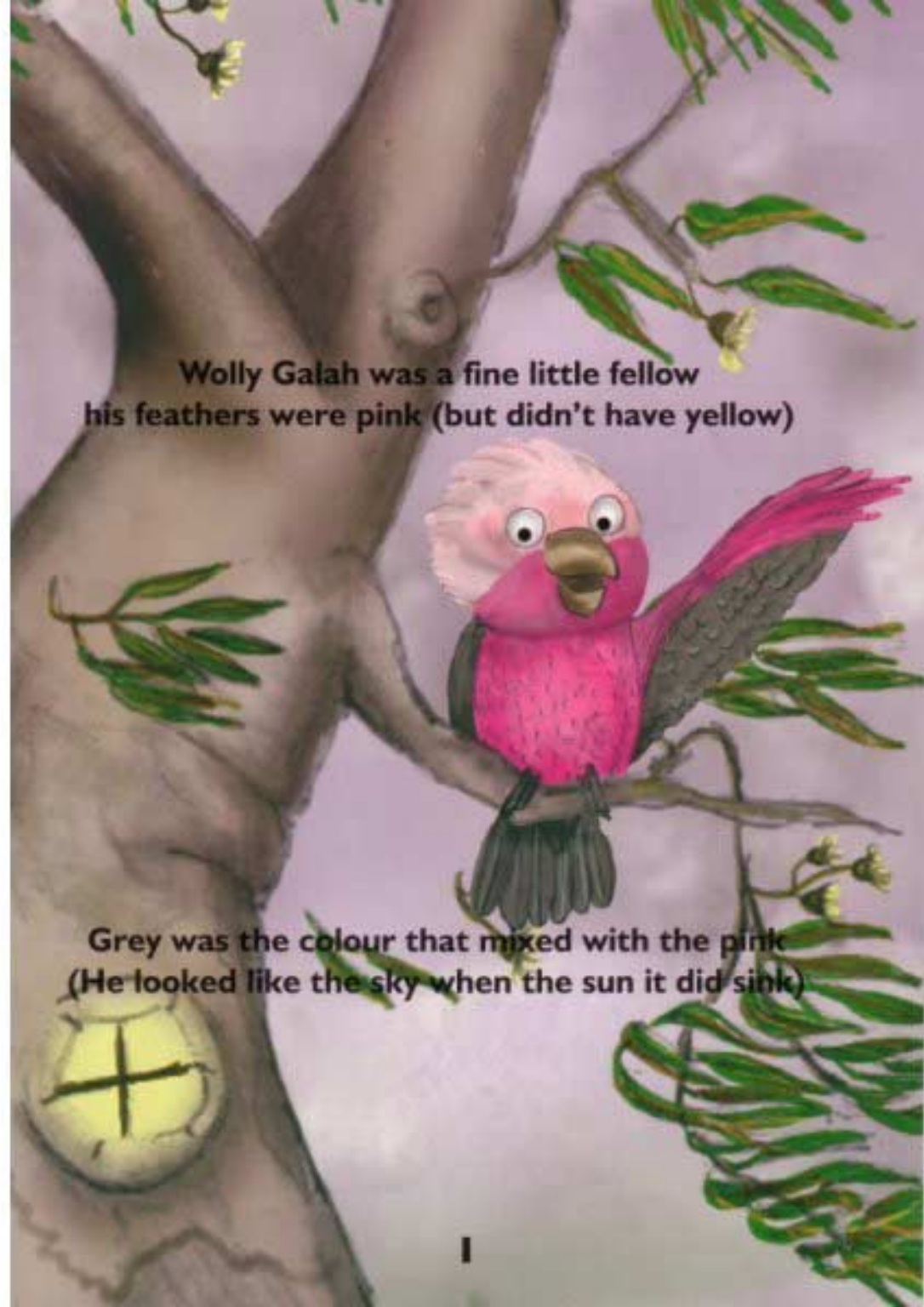

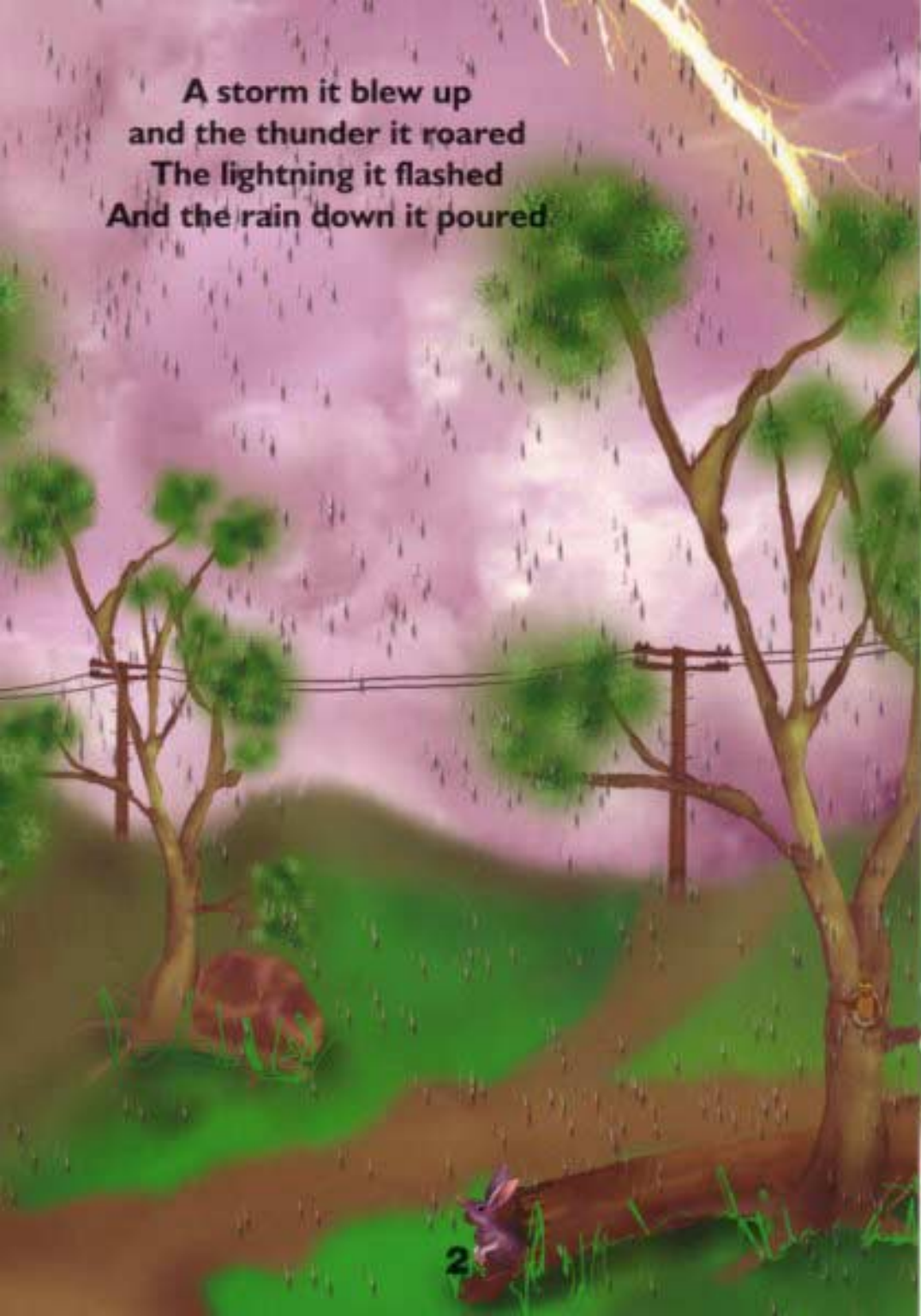


**Wolly Galah was a fine little fellow
his feathers were pink (but didn't have yellow)**

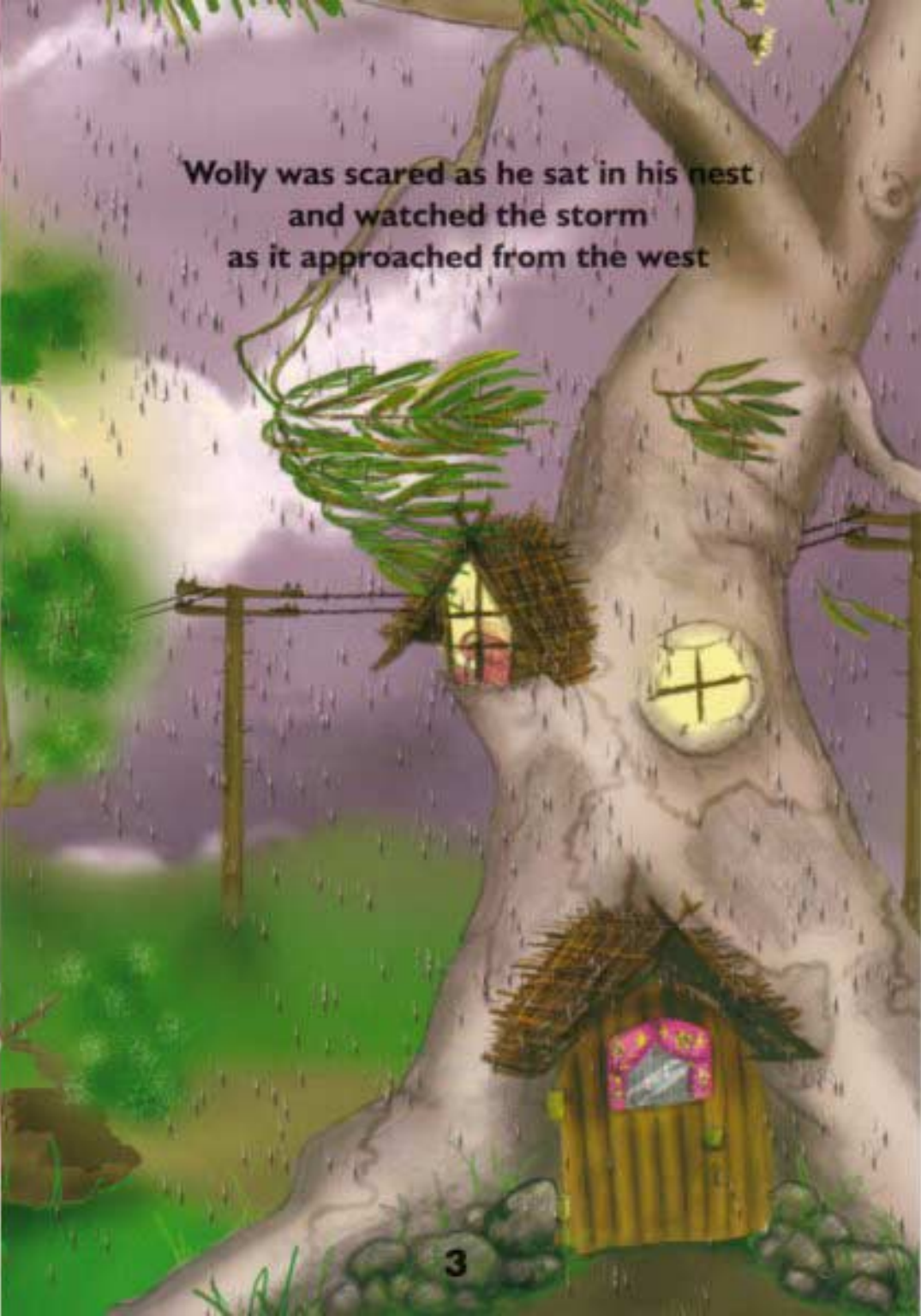
**Grey was the colour that mixed with the pink

And the rain down it poured

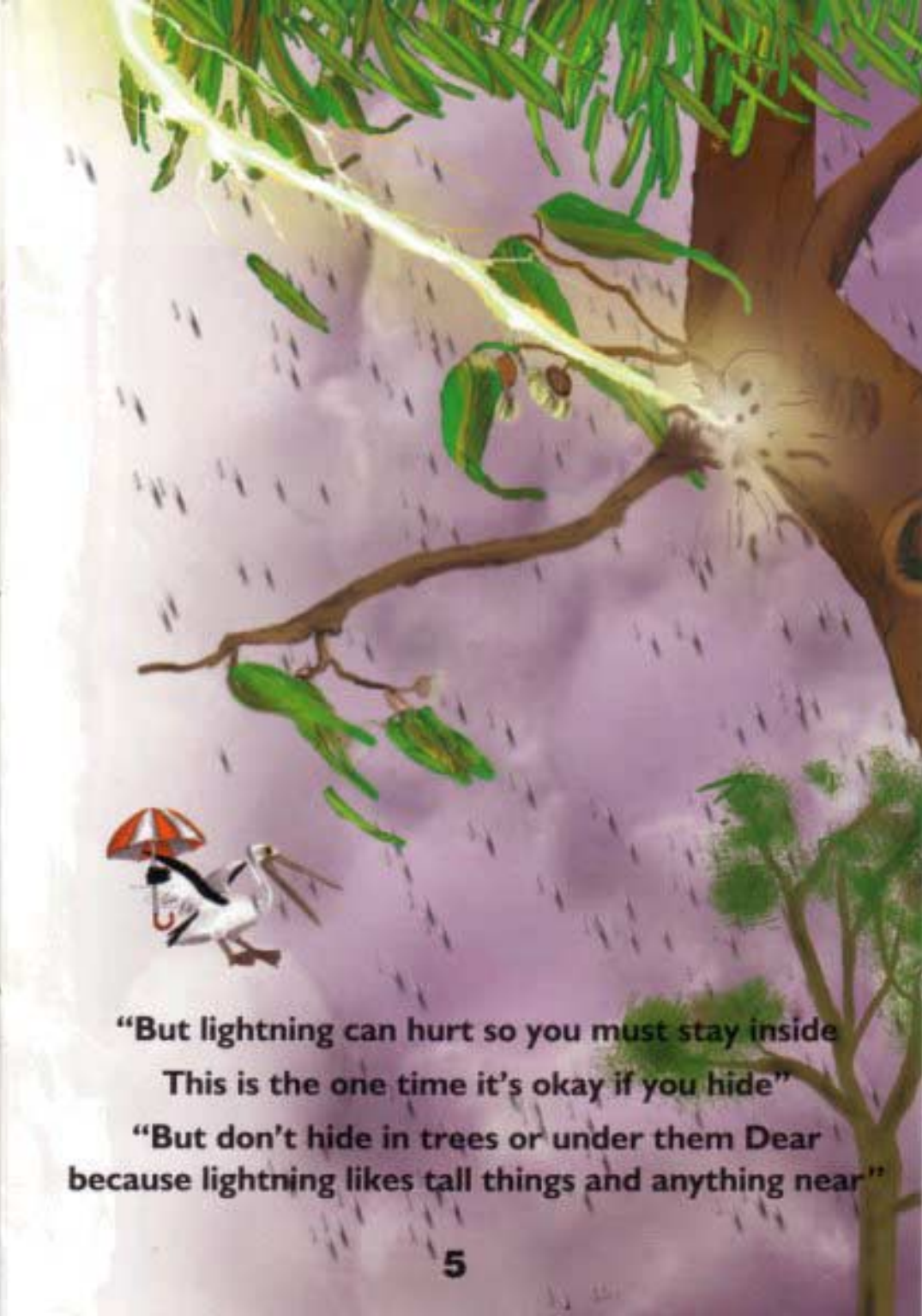


Wolly was scared as he sat in his nest
